 - 7 Congress makes the following findings:

(1) Section 7101(a) of title 38, United States 1 2 Code, requires that the Board of Veterans' Appeals 3 have such number of members and staff as may be 4 found necessary in order to conduct hearings and 5 dispose of appeals properly before the Board in a 6 timely manner. 7 (2) The supporting information submitted along 8 with the budget under section 1105 of title 31, 9 United States Code, for fiscal year 2015 for the De-10 partment of Veterans Affairs states that appeals re-11 ceived by the Board of Veterans' Appeals are ex-12 pected to increase by 52 percent from the 47,763 13 appeals received in 2011 to 72,786 by the end of 14 2015. 15 (3) The annual report of the Board of Vet-16 erans' Appeals for Fiscal Year 2012 indicates that 17 with 64 members, the Board was able to issue 18 44,300 decisions in that fiscal year. 19 (4) The Board also noted in such report that 20 there is a direct and proportional correlation be-21 tween the number of members and staff of the

Board and the number of decisions they can issue.
