



FY2022 AmeriCorps State and National Grant Awards

As a result of the FY2022 AmeriCorps State and National Grant Competition, New Hampshire will receive a total of **\$4,698,138** in funding from AmeriCorps, the federal agency that administers AmeriCorps and other national service programs.

Through this competition, 7 successful grantees operating in New Hampshire will receive **\$3,914,657** in competitive funding from AmeriCorps to support approximately 255 AmeriCorps members. After successfully completing their service, these AmeriCorps members are expected to earn **\$1,207,953** in [Segal AmeriCorps Education Awards](#). Volunteer NH!, the state service commission, will also receive **\$783,481** in formula funding, which will in turn be awarded to state organizations to support additional AmeriCorps members in the coming months.

The following table displays the FY2022 AmeriCorps funding breakdown for New Hampshire, including the full list of successful AmeriCorps grantees. Volunteer NH! will administer grants operating within the New Hampshire borders; AmeriCorps will administer grants operating in multiple states.

These awards include both FY22 Appropriations and American Rescue Plan funding, which was used to increase the AmeriCorps minimum living allowance and to stabilize and expand AmeriCorps programs in your state. Contact governmentrelations@cns.gov for additional American Rescue Plan funding details.

Executive Summaries

City Year New Hampshire FPG

City Year New Hampshire will support 70 full-time AmeriCorps members who will provide full-day education services to students in eight public schools in Manchester, New Hampshire. AmeriCorps members will be responsible for mentoring 500 students, of which 120 will improve literacy skills and 105 will improve math skills and all will develop social-emotionally. AmeriCorps members will leverage 40 volunteers who will be engaged in service projects in our school communities. This program will focus on the AmeriCorps focus area of Education.

FIRST AmeriCorps Program

For Inspiration and Recognition of Science and Technology (FIRST) will support 25 AmeriCorps members. Members will provide assistance with coaching, mentoring, Out-of-school time, and other classroom support. AmeriCorps members will serve at least 3,200 students and teachers, resulting in at least 2,400 students demonstrating an increase in social-emotional skills. The program will focus on Education; specifically to increase social-emotional and holistic skill development in youth and particularly as students return to in-person learning and their communities recover from the COVID-19 pandemic.

Granite State Education Corps

Goodwill Industries of Northern New England will support 42 AmeriCorps members who will provide mentoring and organize activities to increase social and emotional development for youth who have been impacted by adverse childhood experiences in the state of New Hampshire. AmeriCorps members will be responsible for engaging 100 7th-12th graders in youth development programming, with an outcome of increasing the social and emotional skills of 50 youth. AmeriCorps members will leverage 50 volunteers who will be engaged as adult mentors and peer mentors. This program will focus on the AmeriCorps focus area of Education.

Manchester Excels

Goodwill Industries of Northern New England will support 40 AmeriCorps members educationally support low-achieving, high poverty middle/high school pupils in Manchester, New Hampshire. AmeriCorps members will be responsible for raising the academic achievement of at least 210 Manchester pupils. 20 volunteers will be leveraged as guest speakers or program support, offering intervention-based one-on-one assistance with identified pupils to further the impact of the program. The program will focus on the AmeriCorps focus area of Education.

AmeriCorps Victim Assistance Program

The New Hampshire Coalition Against Domestic & Sexual Violence will support 21 AmeriCorps members who will provide direct assistance to victims of domestic and sexual violence, stalking and human trafficking in the state of New Hampshire. AmeriCorps members will be responsible for improving the financial knowledge of 350 economically disadvantaged individuals. AmeriCorps members will leverage 100 volunteers who will be engaged in community awareness projects which will be inclusive of the impact of financial abuse on survivors. This program will focus on the AmeriCorps focus area of Economic Opportunity.





SCA-New Hampshire Conservation Corps

The Student Conservation Association will support 27 AmeriCorps members who will provide conservation stewardship to publicly accessible lands in New Hampshire. AmeriCorps members will be responsible for improving over 25 miles and 40 acres of at-risk ecosystems within the state. AmeriCorps members will leverage 25 volunteers who will engage in conservation stewardship service. This program will focus on the AmeriCorps focus area of Environmental Stewardship.

Squam Lakes Association III

The Squam Lakes Association will support 30 AmeriCorps members who will provide environmental stewardship education and conservation stewardship on trails, waterways, public lands, and natural areas in the Lakes Region of New Hampshire. AmeriCorps members will be responsible for improving 112 miles of trails, 50 acres of public land and lake bottom, and the environmental stewardship knowledge of 2500 individuals. AmeriCorps members will leverage 240 volunteers who will be engaged in conservation stewardship. This program will focus on the AmeriCorps focus area of Environmental Stewardship.
