| Project Location | Recipient Name | Project Purpose | Amount Requested (in thousands) |

| Ashland, NH | Ashland Elementary School | CDS funding for this project would be used to retrofit two public school buildings that utilize a tremendous amount of energy into "net zero" buildings. | \$1,353 |
| Bethlehem, NH | Maplewood Train Restoration Committee | Funds would be used to restore/reconstruct the Maplewood Train Station to make it the centerpiece of the Town of Bethlehem. | \$750 |
| Carroll County, NH | Carroll County | Carroll County would use the CDS funding to renovate its former nursing home and create a community hub of municipal, educational and social services. | \$2,000 |
| Conway, NH | Conway Public Library | The purpose of the project is to redesign the library park so it can be fully integrated into library operations and play a more central role in furthering the mission of the organization. Additionally, the park redesign will improve the experience of the general public when using the facility. | \$625 |
| Enfield, NH | Town of Enfield | CDS funds would be used to improve the energy efficiency of the Town's Public Safety Building. The Public Safety Building will house Enfield's police, fire, and ambulance departments, as well as the Emergency Operations Center. | \$521 |
| Groton, NH | Town of Groton | CDS funds would be used replace a failing culvert on North Groton Road with an upgraded open bottom concrete rigid frame culvert that is 14' wide and 6' high to improve water flow, better manage storm runoff and avoid damage to the road in that area. | \$375 |

| Lebanon, NH | Families Flourish Northeast | CDS funds would be used to build out the footprint of the Homestead Building on the campus of the Alice Peck Day Memorial Hospital in Lebanon to establish and equip a robust commercial kitchen and dining area to provide meals and life skills development for women, children and families. | \$195 |
| North Haverhill, NH | School Administrative Unit 23 | CDS funds would be used to implement the first step of a four step process to convert the Warren Village School from a fossil fuel based school with poor indoor air quality, to a "net zero" building with exceptionally good indoor air quality. | \$1,147 |
| Swanzey, NH | Town of Swanzey | CDS funds would be used to design and reconstruct ~0.65 miles of roads, replace and construct ~2,200 linear feet of sidewalk, extend ~450 linear feet of sewer, and make drainage improvements to North Winchester Street and California Street in the village of West Swanzey. | \$1,310 |
| Whitefield, NH | Whitefield Public Library | The Town of Whitefield would use these funds to address deficits in the current library structure. Funds will be used to renovate the existing 1904 Carnegie library and to expand the space to better meet the needs of library programming and the greater Whitefield community. | \$2,000 |
