Gorham, NH	New Hampshire Community Loan Fund	These funds will be used to preserve 24 low income manufactured homes in Gorham, NH by assisting residents to own the land beneath their homes.	\$500

Intervale, NH	Town of Bartlett	These funds will be used to preserve the 1976 East Branch Bridge located on Town Hall Road, primarily the expansion joint, which has become separated for approximately 85 percent of its length and has allowed water to leak through. This bridge allows access to homes in Bartlett and Jackson, NH.	\$474
Littleton, NH	Town of Littleton, NH	These funds will be used by the Town of Littleton to plan for roadway improvements. Funds will be used to complete environmental review, engineering design, permit identification/assistance, legal assistance, a Cost Benefit Analysis, public outreach and project management.	\$365
